

#### Who may receive the Additional Child Tax Credit?

People who have at least one qualifying child and received less than the full amount of the child tax credit.

### Who is a qualifying child?

#### A child who:

- is your son, daughter, stepchild, adopted child, grandchild, or eligible foster child...and
- was under age 17 at the end of 2003...and
- is a citizen or resident of the United States...and
- is claimed as your dependent.


#### meet all requirements. How do I claim my Additional Child Tax Credit?

Locate the amount, if any, on line 33 (child tax credit) of your completed Form 1040A. If you used Form 1040, find the amount on line 49. It's also on the child tax credit worksheet in the form instructions you used to calculate the credit.

Read the **TIP** at the end of your child tax credit worksheet in your Form 1040A or Form 1040 instructions you used to calculate the credit. If the TIP applies to you, complete the attached Form 8812 to see if you can take the additional credit.
