RIVERTON WYOMING MAN PLEADS GUILTY TO EVADING \$400,000 IN INCOME TAXES

Cheyenne, Wyoming – Gerald E. Anderson, Jr. age 55, of Riverton, Wyoming, waived his right to be indicted by a federal grand jury and was officially charged by an information July 29, 2013 for income tax evasion IRS Criminal Investigation Special Agent in Charge Stephen Boyd announced. Anderson entered into a plea agreement with the government on June 5, 2013. He is scheduled to be sentenced by Chief U.S. District Court Judge Nancy D. Freudenthal on October 7, 2013 at 2 pm.

According to information contained in the charging document, Anderson willfully attempted to evade and defeat the payment of a large part of the income tax due and owing by him to the United States of America. For several years, he concealed and attempted to conceal from the Internal Revenue Service the extent of his income and failed to pay the Internal Revenue Service \$399,364.

“We all pay the price when others don’t pay their fair share of taxes,” said Stephen Boyd, Special Agent in Charge of IRS Criminal Investigation for the State of Wyoming. “This is a reminder if you commit tax evasion; you will be held accountable, brought to justice and in the end pay a significantly higher price.”

Anderson was charged with one count of income tax evasion which carries a penalty of not more than 5 years in federal prison and a fine of up to \$100,000. This case was investigated by IRS-Criminal Investigation and prosecuted by U.S. Attorney’s Office in Wyoming.
