Former Crazy Horse Too Shift Manager is Sentenced for Filing a False Tax Return

Las Vegas, Nevada – Vincent “Vinny” Faraci 58 was sentenced to 15 months in prison and one year of probation in Federal court today by Senior U.S. Judge Lloyd George. Judge George also ordered Faraci to pay \$46,869 in restitution to the IRS. Faraci pleaded guilty back on July 17, 2013 to failing to report \$134,904 in income on the his 2006 tax return when he filed it in 2008.

This will not be Faraci's first time going to prison for income tax crimes. Faraci was one of 16 Crazy Horse Too's employees who pleaded guilty in 2006 to a conspiracy charge of failing to pay taxes on tips and other income. He was sentenced in 2007 to 10 months in prison.

Paul Camacho Special Agent in Charge of IRS Criminal Investigation stated, "On rare occasions it takes more than one instance of prison time for some to appreciate how good IRS Criminal Investigation is at following the money. Usually they are enlightened with this lesson the first go around and take great strides to file accurate returns and pay their fair share timely".

The case was prosecuted by the United States Attorney's Office in Las Vegas with the assistance of the IRS-Criminal Investigation.
