

## Rejected Transmission without an Error Data File, Error Code or due to Error Code AIRER602

To ensure your file is processed with the same received date as your original submission, you need to submit a replacement or correction file; however, you must alter your file so it is not treated as a duplicate. To alter the file you could add a hyphen to the contact person suffix name or add a trailing space to an address field. Some examples of changing the contact name are at the bottom of this page.

### Guidance for Rejected Original or Replacement Files

When submitting the original or replacement file, the following elements have to be modified to replace the rejected Transmissions:

- ACA Business Correlation ID (**UniqueTransmissionId**) in the Manifest should be unique for each transmission (UUID which is part of UTID will be checked for uniqueness against that TCC).
- **DocumentSystemFileNm** in the Manifest should be changed.
- **ChecksumAugmentationNum** in the Manifest should be unique for each transmission.
- **OriginalReceiptId** in the Manifest should include the ReceiptID for the original Transmissions that were rejected.
- **TransmissionTypeCd** in the Manifest should be 'R'.

### Guidance for Rejected Correction Files

Do not use the replacement process if your correction file was rejected. Modify the following elements and resubmit the Correction transmission:

- ACA Business Correlation ID (**UniqueTransmissionId**) in the Manifest should be unique for each transmission (UUID which is part of UTID will be checked for uniqueness against that TCC).
- **DocumentSystemFileNm** in the Manifest should be changed.
- **ChecksumAugmentationNum** in the Manifest should be unique for each transmission.
- **TransmissionTypeCd** in the Manifest should be 'C'.

Examples of changing the contact name:

1. "John Smith" becomes "John Smith –"  
    <PersonFirstNm>John</PersonFirstNm>  
    <PersonLastNm>Smith</PersonLastNm>  
    **becomes**  
    <PersonFirstNm>John</PersonFirstNm>  
    <PersonLastNm>Smith</PersonLastNm>  
    <SuffixNm>-</SuffixNm>
2. "John Smith Jr" becomes "John Smith –Jr"  
    <PersonFirstNm>John</PersonFirstNm>  
    <PersonLastNm>Smith</PersonLastNm>  
    <SuffixNm>Jr</SuffixNm>  
    **becomes**  
    <PersonFirstNm>John</PersonFirstNm>  
    <PersonLastNm>Smith</PersonLastNm>  
    <SuffixNm>-Jr</SuffixNm>
