# Withholding Step 1 – Basic Personal Information

# Withholding Step 2 – Multiple Jobs

Step 2: Multiple Jobs or Spouse Works

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Complete this step if you (1) hold more than one job at a time, or (2) are married filing jointly and your spouse also works. The correct amount of withholding depends on income earned from all of these jobs. Do only one of the following.

(a) Use the estimator at www.irs.gov/W4App for most accurate withholding; or

- (b) Use the Multiple Jobs Worksheet on page 3 and enter the result in Step 4(c) below for roughly accurate withholding; or

CAUTION: If you have privacy concerns, choose (a) or (b). If you and/or your spouse have income from selfemployment, including as an independent contractor, choose (a).

# Withholding Steps 3 and 4 – Adjustments

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Complete Steps 3 through 4(b) on Form W-4 for only one of these jobs. Leave those steps blank for the other jobs. (Your withholding will be most accurate if you complete Steps 3 through 4(b) on the Form W-4 for the highest paying job.)

## Cents Entry Spaces

- Removed the cents divider and cents entry spaces on most forms
- 95% of 1040 returns are completed using software and filed using whole dollars
- Taxpayers can still enter cents, they just have to include the decimal point
- More space on forms for more helpful text



## Numbered 1040 Schedules

- Numbered schedules reduced from six to three
- All lines numbered beginning at 1
- Date of divorce added to alimony lines
- Removed line for Shared
  - Responsibility Payment (SRP)



## New Form 1040-SR

- Required by Bipartisan Budget Act of 2018 (BBA)
- Improved readability
- Standard deduction chart
- Aligned to Form 1040; uses same instructions and same schedules, forms, and other attachments
