



A federal tax **REFUND** may be waiting for you

Even if you're not required to **file**

Do you work? Did a child live with you for over half of the year? Do you pay for someone in your family to attend school? If you answered YES to ANY of these questions, file your federal tax return and you may get a **REFUND** up to:

- **\$6,728 per return** for the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) or **\$1,502 per return** for the EITC if you don't have a child

PLUS

- Any remaining part of the **\$3,000 per child (\$3,600 per child under 6)** Child Tax Credit not received as advance payments in 2021
- **\$1,000 per student** for the American Opportunity Tax Credit (AOTC)

Imagine what you could do with that!

If you claim the EITC, the IRS can't release your refund until mid-February.
Errors on the tax return can cause a delay in processing your claim for the tax credits.
