What is MAPP?

MAPP is a program to enhance cooperation and collaboration with municipal government entities to increase compliance, data sharing and outreach opportunities to the mutual benefit of IRS and agency partners.

IRS has identified five types of city/county government agencies that provide promise for establishing new initiatives with the IRS:

- Tax/Revenue Agencies
- Vendor Regulatory Agencies
- Comptrollers/Finance Agencies
- Property Tax Assessors
- Business Licensing Agencies

In addition, IRS wants to work with associations to reach more municipalities. Local Governmental Liaisons will be a single point of contact for agencies and associations to assist in accessing IRS products and services.
