To access these files, you must have an active e-Services account and be listed on an e-File application with the provider option of Software Developer or State. Your role must be Principal, Responsible Official, or Delegated User with MeF authorities.

With the implementation of the new External Services Authorization Management (ESAM) system, the summary of the IRS e-file Application will have a different look.

The summary information now consists of two pages. Your transmitting company may require both pages for verification to obtain software.

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
