We've denied your request for an extension to file your return

File your return immediately

We've denied your Form 5558, Application for Extension of Time to file an Employee Return, Form 5330, because it was not received on time. A request for an extension must be received on or before the due date of your return.

What you need to do

- File your Form 5330 immediately.
- Complete and sign all required tax forms, include a payment for any taxes due, and mail us your return using the envelope provided.
- If you can't pay the amount due, pay as much as you can now and make payment arrangements that allow you to pay off the rest over time. Visit www.irs.gov and search for keyword: "tax payment options" for more information about:
 - Installment and payment agreements—download required forms or save time and money by applying online if you qualify
 - Automatic payment deductions from your bank account
 - Payroll deductions
 - Credit card payments
- If you are owed a refund, you must file a return within 3 years of the return due date, or 2 years from the date the tax was paid, whichever is later.

If you don't file your return immediately, penalties and interest may accrue.
