The income information you reported on your [04 13P] Form [05 9V] is less than the income information we have on file from sources such as your employers. This means you may owe additional tax.

WHAT YOU NEED TO DO IMMEDIATELY

Review this letter and compare what you listed on your [06 13P] tax return to the amounts reported to the IRS by others.

If you agree with the information reported by income sources:

1. Review your return for additional errors or omissions.
2. Complete a Form 1040X, Amended U.S. Income Tax Return, as soon as possible.
3. Send your completed Form 1040X to the same IRS address where you mailed your original tax return. If you e-filed your original tax return, you must mail a paper amended return. To find the correct mailing address, refer to the Form 1040X instructions.

If you don't agree with the information reported by income sources:

- You don't need to respond to this letter.
- If you think your return is correct and there's a mistake in the income information received from the income sources, contact the sources directly to ask them to correct their records, as necessary.

WHAT WILL HAPPEN IF YOU DON'T EITHER FILE AN AMENDED RETURN OR ASK THE
INCOME SOURCES TO CORRECT THEIR RECORDS

The errors will remain in your file. We may later determine you owe additional tax and charge you interest and penalties if you paid the tax

you owe after the tax return filing deadline. You may also continue to have similar reporting problems next year.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU THINK YOU'RE A VICTIM OF IDENTITY THEFT

If you believe someone is illegally using your Social Security number for federal income tax purposes, send us all of the following:

- A copy of a valid U.S. federal or state government-issued form of identification (example: driver's license, state identification card, Social Security card, passport, etc.)
- A copy of either a police report or a completed IRS Form 14039, Identity Theft Affidavit
- A signed statement identifying each item you believe was affected by the possible identity theft
